Message from the head:

This week myself and other members of the senior leadership team have been in classes doing learning walks. We were there to observe the teaching and learning and had a special focus looking at oracy and language support in the lessons. It is so good to be able to see the amazing lessons the teachers prepare for the children and we were especially impressed by the language models being used by staff and the skilled questioning being used to develop and support children in their knowledge and understanding. Talk is such an important part of learning and a focus area right from Nursery (with the Camden Kids Task Project) all the way up to Year 6. High quality spoken language, tailoring language to situations—knowing when to be formal or informal, all feeds into greater reading and writing skills too. Talk cannot, and should not be ignored—it's as important as reading and writing. I would urge you to maximise you talking opportunities with your children, when watching TV and films, or out and about, or reading books, take every opportunity you can to talk to them—ask their opinions on things, ask to not just to tell you a fact, but justify or explain reasoning, their opinions, their ideas—just listen to them! The more they practice speaking, and also are involved in conversations (learning to listen as well as speak), the more their vocabulary grows—by 10 years old, most children should have a vocabulary of over 20,000 words! Lets support them to get to that figure and beyond if possible! Have a lovely weekend.




The theme this year is 'Famous buildings and landmarks around the world'. Big thankyou to school council for coming up with this year's theme.
