Driving here? Turn off your engine!

Based on a study from 2013 of NO² levels around London schools (NO² most associated with car emissions) Fleet was among the 100 most effected primary schools. Our mean level that year was 47ug/m³. This was more than the legal mean of 40ug/m³. Pollution has not improved since. Mr M^cGibbon has been out after school

since his last piece in the newsletter about driving to school to see how many cars are parking outside the gates. While we are concerned by the number of you driving, more worrying is the fact that many of the cars outside are sitting with their engines on while they wait, adding to the fumes. If you feel you must drive we would urge you to at least turn off the engine while you wait and not compound an already bad situation. We use our grounds and anything that reduces the emissions in the area benefits school.
