Message from the head

Thank you to all of you who were able to come along to the information/coffee morning this week and the session I did in the evening. I hope you found it useful. They have worked incredibly hard this year and I wish them all the best for next week. While opinion on testing is divided for now, they are part of the educational landscape. We do our best to ensure that they are prepared for the tests but not at the expense of the wider curriculum. If your child is nervous about them please reassure them that they should not worry. It's simply an opportunity to show off what they have learnt—we are proud of them already and know they will do the best they can. As has been mentioned in previous newsletters, the works on the top pitch will start on July 1st so that the project is finished in time for the new school year in September. It will mean that we are not able to use the junior playground for the last three weeks of term in July. During that time we will be using the grass area to the front of school along with the infant playground for play and lunch breaks. We will be doing a dry run after the half term break so the children get used to this. As well as the pitch development we have a number of other building and conditioning works happening this summer on heating, water systems and the roofs. Some of this conditioning works will be starting in June. To accommodate this work we will have a small portacabin sited in the infant playground for the contractors base from the beginning of June. We will position this to cause the least amount of impact on the play space. We appreciate your patience and understanding while all these works go on, and while inconvenient, we know they will leave us with an improved site and better facilities.

I'd like to take the chance to say thank you to those of you who have sponsored me for the cycle challenge I am doing to raise money for Cancer Research UK. The event is this weekend—I'm starting to get a bit nervous about the 300km distance I need to cover! 
