I'd like to take this opportunity to say a huge well done to our Year 6 children (and the staff who have taught them over their time at Fleet) on completing their SATs tests this week. Whatever your opinion of these tests they are, for now at least, a requirement of the final year of primary school. They can be stressful for children, families and school staff alike. I'd like to recognize the effort made by Ms. Kingham and the rest of the staff who ensure that the children's Year 6 is not defined by these tests and make sure the year is not turned into an endless drive of test preparation as I know it can be in some schools. Instead, Year 6 at Fleet is, and should be, just like any other year in the school—with access to a rich and varied curriculum with opportunities for projects and trips. You could have walked into Year 6 at any point this year and seen this in action. No curriculum subject was dropped in place of a narrow Maths and English focus. They have been on as many trips and completed as many projects as the other classes. Their class environment is rich with artwork that they have had time to do throughout the year. This will continue to the end of the year and we believe their readiness for secondary school will be better for it. Thanks to all the parents who support this approach. Music Tuition

At Fleet the children get a rich music education including whole class tuition in Years 3 (ukulele), Year 4 (recorder) and Year 5 (trumpets and trombones). On top of this there is the chance for parents to sign up and pay for individual instrument tuition in violin, piano, guitar and drums. These lessons are provided by the Camden Music Service and the teachers come to the school. The lessons are taught during school day. Costs are:


