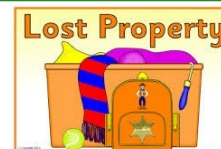


## Family Learning Sessions

A big thank you to the RSPB who came in to work with classes on Thursday and help us to celebrate 'National Outdoor Classroom Day'.



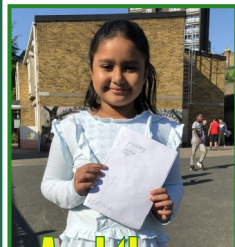
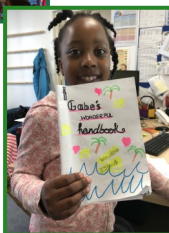
## Down on the farm!

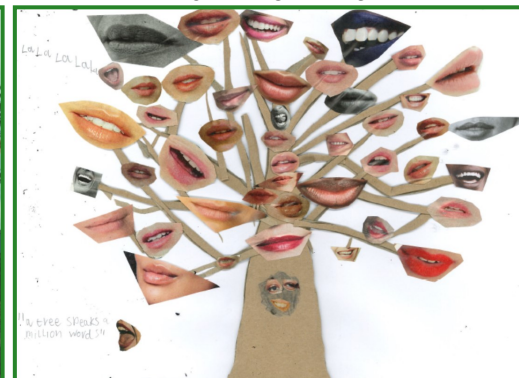
