

#### **Music Tuition**

At Fleet the children get a rich music education including whole class tuition in Years 3 (ukulele), Year 4 (recorder) and Year 5 (trumpets and trombones). On top of this there is the chance for parents to sign up and pay for individual instrument tuition in violin, piano, guitar and drums. These lessons are provided by the Camden Music Service and the teachers come to the school. The lessons are taught during school day. Costs are:

10 x shared lessons = £76.50 per term 10 x 20 minute individual = £102.00 per term 10 x 30 minute individual = £153 .00 per term There are subsidised places (50% off) for children on Free school







Year 4 are investigating sound proofing materials by planning a fair test. They're all set to go and will do the test next week.
