It was great to see them working so well together. After an amazing lunch (the food is so good!) it was time for the climbing wall (particular mention for Ruby and Isabelle who raced to the top and abseiled back down brilliantly conquering their fears). They also created natural art (making art using only natural elements—we think we may have a few Andy Goldsworthy protégés in our

At the CLC this week Year 6 were using Google Sketch Up. They were set the task of designing and building an art gallery to house a selection of Aztec artefacts. There were certain design requirements such as:

- Maximum size 15m x 15m
- Any shape and include a roof
- No more than two rooms
- Must have good light
- Needs an entrance
- Must have two or three seats
- Allow space for exhibits

They also designed Aztec coins which are going to be printed using the 3D printer at the CLC. The work they were doing was by no means easy but they showed great perseverance, working really hard to problem solve and complete the tasks.



You may remember that last year Fleet raised money to buy some

chickens for Seedlings School in Malinidi, Kenya. They planned to use the chickens to raise money by selling their meat and eggs to help pay for teachers and other things they need. The chickens are now well settled and this week they laid their first eggs! As well as the eggs arriving this week so did the latest letters from the children at Seedlings School for our Year 6s.
