Over the last two years we have seen our budget cut, costs rise, staffing reduced and a number of curriculum experiences either reduced or removed. The staff here are doing an amazing job, so it might sometimes seem that we are immune to the problems we see more starkly elsewhere—I can assure you we are not. The situation is getting harder all the time—each year it becomes harder and harder to balance our budget without cutting more and more. Please support this attempt to raise the profile of the problem by attending the rally if you can and by coming to our fair next weekend and helping us raise much needed funds to refurbish our junior playground. The cost is high to improve such a large playround—all of the money needs to come from fundraising as we have no school budget to do it. Bikes and Scooters

As you all know we are very keen on sustainable travel at Fleet—be that walking, cycling or scooting—we encourage as many of you as possible to use these means to get to school. It is great to see how many children are currently scooting and cycling. Recently there has been a number of incidents of scooters and bikes being used by children they do not belong to, in some cases resulting in damage. We can, and do, manage this when it happens during play or lunch. However, we are aware that this often happens after school when children have been handed back to parents and they are still on site—especially at class teas. We are going to ask that all children remaining behind on school grounds with their parents for whatever reason use the infant playground—not the junior playground. Please be vigilant to ensure they are not using bikes and scooters that are not theirs. To avoid bikes and scooters being in the playground we already have bike storage next to the greenhouse and have ordered some scooter specific storage to go by the door to the office in front of the school. Once this is in place scooters will not be stored in the playground anymore. We would hate anyone to stop travelling to school by scooter because they were worried their scooter may be damaged. This week, our Punctuality award goes to Year 6 with Just 1 late! 29 lates for whole school—we beat this next week!




Attendance Award
