Our Attendance Award this week goes to Nursery & Reception class, both with 99%. Well done to them! Remember, if your child is unwell or has an appointment, please call the Office.



On Tuesday, we were visited by scientists from the Crick Institute. They performed workshops with some classes (Year 5—went to the Crick Institute itself for their workshop today!) In Year 1 they did "What's in the Bag" – a 40 min session introducing young children to the idea of being a scientist and using their senses to identify a mystery object. Year 3's workshop was "Jaws, Joints and Jobs for Juniors" – a 70 min session using bones, model organs and fossils to seek patterns in biology. Year 4's workshop was "Sounds like Fun" – a 60 min interactive workshop using comparative and fair testing to investigate how sound travels through different materials and how our hearing works. After school there was a parent session on Microscopy where the Year 6 children were able to show parents and carers what they had learnt in their workshop. Thanks to those parents who were able to take time and come along and a big thank you to the Crick Institute for coming in and having Year 5 visit them.
