Reminder for Nursery Parents

This is so that we can continue to receive the funding we need to staff the Nursery for 30 hour places. We understand that this is inconvenient, however it is a process entirely out of the school's control. Thank you.

Please remember that lunches need to be paid for in advance and cost £2.35 per day/£11.75 per week. If your lunch account is in arrears by over £40, your child will need to switch over to packed lunches if it remains unpaid. Thank you.







