You should have received a letter this week about 'Parent Hub'. This is a free app that you download onto your mobile phone. It allows us to send you messages and letters electronically. Having discussed with many of you the topic of communication we know these systems are not ideal—especially for parents who don't collect (in terms of paper letters not making it home)! We think this new system will be far more efficient, not to mention a great way to save money by reducing the amount of texts and letters we send, as well as being better for the environment and reducing our paper waste. You need a code specific to the class your children are in so that we can filter the messages you are sent. The code you need was in the letter that went home. 



# World Book Day
