
Message from the head

Top Pitch

You may remember from previous newsletters that we have been working for a long time on a project to develop the top pitch into a state of the art all weather football pitch. This project was started a number of years ago. It's been a



long process involving lots of preparation, planning permission, community engage ment events and lots of different funding requests. We are pleased to say we are finally at the point where work will be starting this summer. Planning has been agreed, funding secured and contractors appointed. The works start on 1st July and should be finished by the end of the summer holidays—in time to be a fantastic new facility for school and the community to use from September. The junior playground will be out of use during July with the juniors and infants sharing the infant playground and the grassed area for play and lunchtimes.

Parents' Association

The Fleet Parents' Association do an amazing job organising and mobilising the school community to help raise money that is vital to our school. As well as specific projects, such as our iPads, the music studio and books, a large part of the school trip budget comes from their fundraising efforts. You should be aware that we are soon to lose 3 of the main drivers in the PA—Alison and Mette are both leaving the country, while Jo's time at Fleet will come to an end when he daughter leaves Year 6 to start secondary school. This will leave a big gap to fill for the PA. The PA is not something one person has to take on. Alison, Mette, Jo and Anna have really made it work by sharing the main role between them—and the

We really need some parents to step forward to take over from them when they leave and ideally before so that they can hand over all the information to make the job as easy as possible for those stepping into their shoes. We know there are so many talented parents out there who would be brilliant in this role. Please speak to them if you are able to give some time to this role as you will be performing a vital element of what makes the Fleet community so special.
