#### Packed Lunches on trips

Can we remind parents that school policy on packed lunches applies on trips as it does in school. This policy is in line with guidance from the Camden Healthy Eating Team. We are trying hard to encourage the children to think about healthy lifestyles. There are opportunities once a week through the class teas for treats after school. We have noticed recently that some children are bringing in cakes, crisps and other items not permitted in packed lunches. This is particularly a problem on trips. Please remember, packed lunches shouldn't include:

- Crisps-instead, seeds, vegetables and fruit (with no added sugar/fat).
- Confectionery such as chocolate bars, chocolate-coated biscuits and sweets and chewing gum.
- Meat products such as sausage roll, individual pies, corned meat and sausage/chipolatas should be included only occasionally for example, on a Friday when fish and chips are served in school lunches.
- Fizzy or sugary drinks.


