Attendance Award

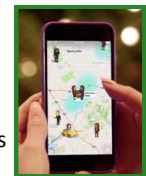
The award for this week goes to Year 6 Class with 98%. Well done to them—fabulous!

Haverstock Hill Sinfonia



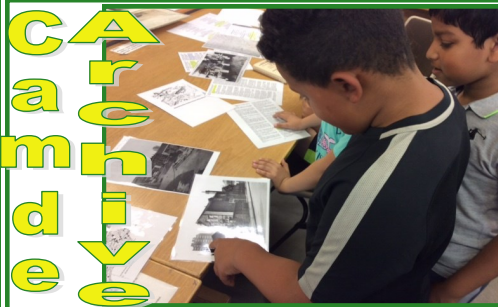
On Thursday night 5 of our Year 5 children took part in a concert at Haverstock School. They have been practicing for the last 10 weeks along with musicians
