School Dinners Reminder

If you are going to change the lunch your child has from School dinners to packed lunch, you must inform the Office immediately. If you don't, you'll be



charged for them whether your child eats one or not. The kitchen place orders and cook quantities based on the number of children we have on the system wanting school dinners. If you don't inform the Office, they won't have been changed over. Also, for Year 3 parents, your child's lunch is no longer free under the Government scheme for free lunches for all under 7s. If you don't gualify for Free School Meals as determined by the Government criteria and verified by Camden, you will now have to pay for your child's school dinner. The cost of a school dinner is £2.13. Please see the Office for more information or to find out about applying for Free School Meals.

Last year our attendance for the year was just above 95%. However, we know we can do even better. Attendance and punctuality are consistently shown in studies to be one of the biggest contributors to school success for children. We hope you will continue to work with us this year to improve our attendance and punctuality even more and ensure children don't miss out on valuable learning opportunities. Remember, we do not authorise absence during term time unless in exceptional and unavoidable circumstances. Also, please check the term dates carefully (they are on the website and on the back of this newsletter) so that you don't book any holidays when your children should be in school. Please don't assume because a friend or family member's child at a different school is off that we will be closed too. Dates vary from school to school, local authority to local authority, it's best to check. In terms of absence due to illness, if your child is a little under the weather, help them to build up resilience by not automatically keeping them off school for minor coughs or colds. Encourage and help them to come in. If once in, a child is really struggling and needs to be at home, we will call you straight away to collect them. Equally, if you do decide to keep your child home due to illness and part way through the day they perk up, bring them in for the remainder of the day. Dear Schools,

With more links being made between the negative impacts of air pollution on human health, especially children's health, we really want to hear from you. Camden is seeking feedback on how we can improve the air we breathe.

We all have a role to play in improving air quality in Camden, that's why we're asking you to help develop our Clean Air Action Plan.

During our Camden 2025 community conversations you told us that air quality is vitally important, with participants in particular asking that we work together to improve the air that we share.

With this in mind, we launched our Camden Clean Air Partnership in July, bringing together residents, local businesses and campaigners for a 'Design Day', exploring practical ideas for air quality improvement.

Key themes covered on the Design Day included:

- 1 Transport emissions
- 2. Construction and development emissions
- 3. Public health and awareness raisina
- 4. Delivery, servicing and freight
- 5. Communities and schools
- 6. What can you do to help improve local air quality

Now we're opening the discussion wider with a new website where you can have your say. We're keen to capture as many of your voices as possible to help us develop our Clean Air Action Plan which will launch next year.

Please note that this engagement is not a formal consultation our future Clean Air Action Plan but rather a review of the Design Day outputs, which will inform the Action Plan development.
