- 1599: Original Globe Theatre built
- 1608: Bubonic Plague ravages London
- 1613: The Globe burned down
- 1614: Globe rebuilt
- 1642: During English Civil War, theatre closed
- 1644: Globe demolished
- 1969: Sam Wanamaker campaigns to build New Globe
- 1997: new Globe theatre inaugurated by Queen Elizabeth II



William Shakespeare (1564- 1616) is a famous British playwright. Shakespeare is considered to be one of the most talented writers of all time.

Shakespeare lived around the late 16th century and early 17th century, and in between the reigns of Queer Elizabeth I and King James I. Both of them saw some of the plays he wrote, which are still performed today. Some of the phrases that Shakespeare wrote have even become part of our everyday language!
