Key Vocabulary

Aqueduct: A system of pipes and channels used to bring water into towns.

Amphitheatre: A place similar to a stadium, where Romans went to watch people and animals fighting.

Conquer: To take control of an area by force.

Druid: A Celtic priest.

Empire: A large area of land, or a group of countries, ruled by a single person, government, or ruler.

Forum: A large meeting place in the centre of Rome, where markets would take place.

Gladiator: A professional fighter in ancient Rome who entertained crowds in amphitheatres.

Hypocaust: Roman central heating.

Iceni Tribe: The people who lived in modern day Norfolk.

Rebel: To fight against something. A rule breaker!

Republic: A country without a king, queen or emperor. When Rome became a republic, male Roman citizens voted for their leaders.

Settlement: A place where people live, they can be small like a hamlet, or large like a city.
