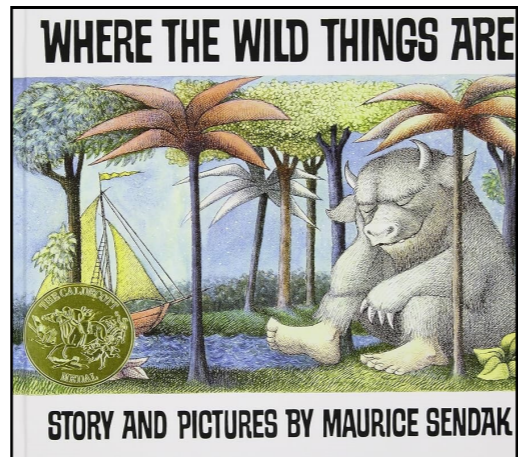


# History

<b>Wild</b>	A plant or animal growing and living in a natural environment.

<b>Setting</b>	Where a story takes place.
<b>Characters</b>	Who is in the story.
<b>Problem</b>	Something wrong or challenging that happens.
<b>Solution</b>	Working out a way to solve the problem.
<b>Moral</b>	What you can learn from a story.
<b>Mythological Creatures</b>	Animals/beings/hybrids that don't exist in real life like dragons, unicorns and werewolves.
