Debbie showed us round the school. We minimised the amount of time we spent inside and did not go into individual classrooms.

Entrances

Three entrances are being used and they all have signs about Covid and expectations around behaviour. They also show the different gates and times for different year groups and illustrate the bubbles that have been created.



General

There are mobile hand sanitisation units at all entries to buildings in the school as well as signs reminding people to sanitise their hands and wear masks. Some staff and some children were wearing masks.

Meals

Year groups eat separately and some eat outside but this is weather dependent. Meals are currently served as a hot packed lunch in paper bags. The school is trying to organise hot lunches for those who have school lunches but have been unable to source reusable containers that can be washed in the steriliser in the kitchen. Debbie is getting costings for a dishwasher and Camden have been asked to fund this as it is needed as a consequence of the pandemic.

Playgrounds

There are separate playground areas for each year group and there are markings in the playground showing where to stand to keep social distance. There are one way system markers for when parents collect their children in school.

There is a new tap that children use to fill up their water bottles. They are not allowed to drink directly out of the water fountains but can use them to fill their bottles which they bring from home.

Toilets

Each bubble/year group has their own toilets and all toilets have appropriate signs including ones about hand washing .

Classrooms

We did not enter any classrooms but understand that there are sprays and gels in each classroom that the children and adults use and the children do not work facing one another.
