


Reading

Be careful, this can be easily confused with f! When you make the th sound, your tongue touches your teeth. When you make the f sound, the the noise from your mouth goes thought your teeth.

Maths

This week spend time working on knowing what operation (+ or -) to use when writing a number sentence. I have 3 apples here and 4 apples here. How many is that

altogether? How do I write that down? I have 7 apples and I eat two of them. How many do I have left?



It's important the children are able to think about what is being asked and if it's addition or subtraction.
