

Writing

Listen to the story video of me reading, Say Hi to Hedgehogs!



This book has lots of interesting facts about hedgehogs. Did you know that hedgehog numbers are dropping? Make a 'Help the Hedgehogs' poster that you can stick up for your

neighbours to see.

You can help hedgehogs by digging a small tunnel under your fence so they can get through to find food, or make a little hole in it. For a treat, you could leave a little plate of cat food out for them. (Don't put out bread and milk as this makes hedgehogs very ill.) Your poster could let people know they could leave a little pile of leaves for a hedgehog needing a home. If clearing leaves, check there are no hedgehogs living in them. You don't want to

accidently put one in the bin!

In the story video, there is a little bit of modelled writing at the end to help your child with their poster.

Phonics





This week we will be learning a new sound, sh. Check out this video about the sh sound https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=eqigJZm5aa4

Using real objects, make little sets to add together. Then write the number sentence.

For example, there are 3 shoes over here and 4 over here. How many altogether? Let's write that down. 3+4=7

Ramadan Mubarak to a lot of our families out there! You could make a card for one of your friends or family member as Ramadan begins.


The World
