Read this week's poem.


Look out for rhyming words.




Maths


Brush up on knowing one more and one less.

Draw up a table similar to the one below. You could roll one dice to write in the middle, or more.









One Less	My Number	One More

You could try some of these ideas too.






Extra challenge some might be interested in.
