

## Role-Play Writing

Role-play keeps writing fun and is a great way to engage the children with writing.

It can also keep them busy making props as well.

 Put on a show – write tickets, show posters and show times.



- Set up a café write menus, order forms and opening times.
- Set up a doctors area include old items from your first aid cupboard such as old bandages, empty calpol syringes etc.
  Write prescription notes, patient details, draw x-ray sheets.
- Set up a fire or police station—include maps, an old telephone, notebooks etc. Children can write incident reports.
- Pretend to be a spy and write secret messages to each other.

## Other Ideas

- Make zig zag books
- Write a cookbook with real or made up recipes
- Make All About Me books include birthday, family members, favourite things, physical features.
- Write *Long, long ago...* stories. They could be about; dinosaurs, kings and queens, knights, pirates, Vikings, etc.
- Party Invitations Invite all their toys to a party.

• Pretend a fairy, elf, whatever your child might like best has sent them a letter.

Write letters back and forth.

- Send letters, emails or texts to family members.
- Write fact files about favourite animals.
- Write love letter.
- Write Netflix reviews to send to friends.



• Bullet point, *How to be a \_\_\_\_\_* ideas.

Such as... How to be a ninja or How to be a superhero.

- Keep a diary.
- Change the ending to some of the fairy tales we have enjoyed this term.
