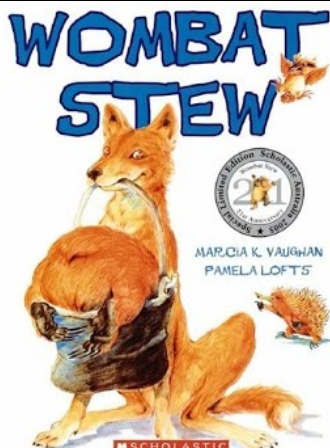


# Animal Atlas

# Amazing Australian Animals

These are all marsupials. There are lots of marsupials in Australia.

Marsupials are unique because they give birth to teeny tiny babies that crawl into the mother's pouch on her tummy where they grow. A baby marsupial is called a joey.

A baby kangaroo is the size of a bean when it is born.



These guys look pretty cute!

This is a Quokka



Quokkas are nocturnal marsupials. They're some of the smallest members of the big foot family, which also includes kangaroos and wallabies. The quokka lives in swamps and scrublands, tunneling through the brush to create shelters and hideouts and emerging at night to find food.





There are two mammals that lay eggs that live in Australia. The platypus and the echidna. A baby echidna is called a puggle. How cute!



A platypus is also very interesting because it has a beak and webbed feet like a bird. A mother platypus feeds her baby milk.

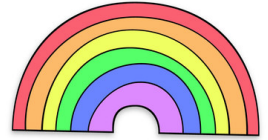


# Class Photo
