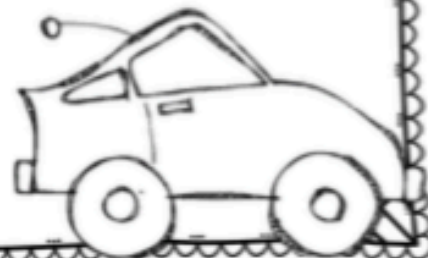

This week we are learning the vowel digraph *oo*.

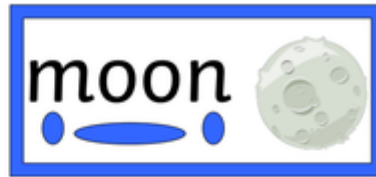

# Strange and Mysterious Southeast Asian Creatures

Sun Bear – This is the world's smallest bear but has the largest teeth in proportion to their body. They are sometimes called honey bears because they love honey.



Malayan Tapir – Their black and white camouflage make them look like a large rock.



Rhinoceros Hornbill – This is similar in size to a swan!





Slow Loris – This is a venomous mammal. They have glands on their elbows that can release venom. There are only a few mammals that have venom.



Siamang – They have a throat sack that can grow to be as big as their head! They use to help them call out.



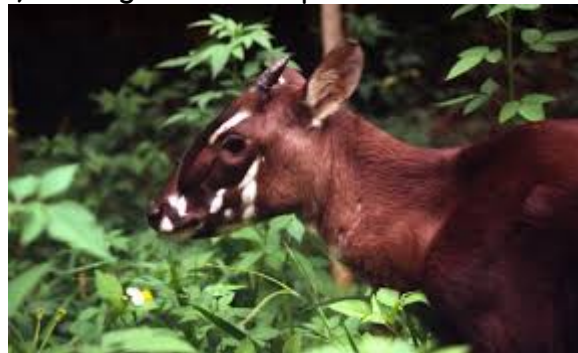
Tree Kangaroo – These animals hop along like their Australian cousins but they can also use their long tail to climb trees.



Indochinese Tiger – These tigers are darker than tigers that live in India.



Saola – These are called the Asian unicorn because they are so mysterious. People have only managed to take photos of them a handful of times.



Giant Clam – These can live for over 100 years!





Sumatran Clouded Leopard – They get their name from their cloud like spots.  
Aren't they beautiful!



Drakco Lizards – These lizards can glide through the air from tree to tree.





Tarsier - They have the largest eyes of any mammal in relation to their body. Their eyeballs are bigger than their brains. They have big eyes to help them see at night.



Komodo Dragon - These are the largest living lizards on earth!





Proboscis Monkey – Their nose helps them attract a mate. They are good swimmers and have webbed hands and feet. This helps them swim away from crocodiles!

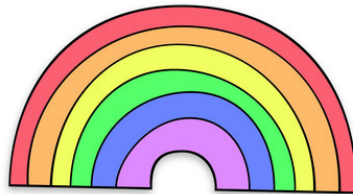


**Expressive Arts and Design** – Draw, paint or collage a rainbow for our class photo.
