# **Poetry** Toolbox

#### metaphor

Tell the reader that something is something else.

#### imagery

Give them help to form a picture in their mind.

#### simile

Tell the reader that something is *'like'* or *'as'* something else.

#### personification

Give human qualities to something that isn't human.

#### alliteration

Start some words in a line using the same sound or letter.

#### rhyme

Use words with similar sounding final syllables.

#### repetition

Repeat a word or phrase.

#### onomatopoeia

Use words that mimic the sound of the noun or verb they describe.

#### Sledging

Numb hands, frozen feet, Shivery trudge to the top, Giggling, sliding down!

#### Cosy

Icy breath, red nose,

Snow falling with freezing winds,

Crumpets by the fire.

#### **Hedgehog Hibernation**

Curled up, eyes closed tight, Prickly, sniffy, snuffle snores, Snoozing until spring.

#### Icicles

Drips frozen in time,


