

DT: Recycling Games

Think about what we have learned in <u>Science</u> this week about <u>recycling</u> <u>and materials</u>. Now, take a look at this video on how to make an <u>Egg</u> <u>Carton Spelling Challenge</u> (the relevant part of the video starts at 1:02): <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Thu33Lx4Tc0</u>

Your challenge is to make this Egg Carton Spelling Challenge.

All you need is an <u>empty egg carton</u>, a <u>pen, pencil or crayon</u> and something you can <u>throw</u> into the carton (eg: pennies, buttons, counters from another game you have). On one side of the egg cartoon, write all the <u>vowels</u> (go back to our learning on vowels in Phonics last week if you need some help). Now, on the other side of the carton, choose and write some <u>consonants</u> (the letters in the alphabet which aren't vowels). Now, throw in <u>three or more counters</u>, close the lid and shake the carton. Open and make a word with the letters where the counters have landed (a real word that Bob would eat and not a fake word that Obb would eat!)



Use the same items to make an <u>Egg Carton Maths Challenge</u>, using <u>numbers</u> instead of letters. You can decide whether to use <u>addition</u> <u>or subtraction</u> for each game. Good luck!
