



### DT: Recycling Games

Think about what we have learned in Science this week about recycling and materials. Now, take a look at this video on how to make an Egg Carton Spelling Challenge (the relevant part of the video starts at 1:02): <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Thu33Lx4Tc0>

### Your challenge is to make this Egg Carton Spelling Challenge.



All you need is an empty egg carton, a pen, pencil or crayon and something you can throw into the carton (eg: pennies, buttons, counters from another game you have). On one side of the egg carton, write all the vowels (go back to our learning on vowels in Phonics last week if you need some help). Now, on the other side of the carton, choose and write some consonants (the letters in the alphabet which aren't vowels). Now, throw in three or more counters, close the lid and shake the carton. Open and make a word with the letters where the counters have landed (a real word that Bob would eat and not a fake word that Obb would eat!)



Use the same items to make an Egg Carton Maths Challenge, using numbers instead of letters. You can decide whether to use addition or subtraction for each game. Good luck!
