We do not expect every single task to be completed. What we are providing are activities in line with the National Curriculum to keep the children busy, thinking and being creative. Whilst it is important to keep learning key facts and skills and acquiring knowledge, this is also a great opportunity for your child to explore their interests further and be creative. Please share a sample of their learning with me every week: a piece of English or Maths and perhaps another piece of learning of which they are proud. We'll get there so please try not to worry. Y1 are wonderful thinkers and doers and they constantly amaze me, so take our current situation as an opportunity to see and hear more about what and how they learn; I hope their minds and ways of thinking challenge your own as often as they do mine.

English
