


This week we are learning about the prefix un-.

What happens to a word when we add un- to the beginning of it?





#### Monday 6<sup>th</sup> July 2020 LO: I can identify the prefix un-



When we add un- to the beginning of a word, we change its meaning to the opposite. Cool language trick, isn't it?

Look at the example below. My word is happy. To change it to mean the opposite, I <u>add un- to the</u> <u>beginning of the word</u>, so it becomes <u>unhappy</u>.




