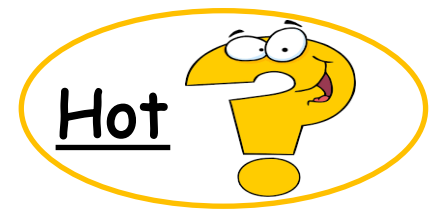

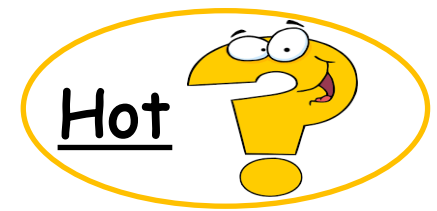
Dear Diary,

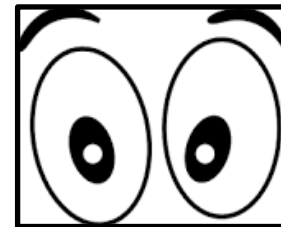
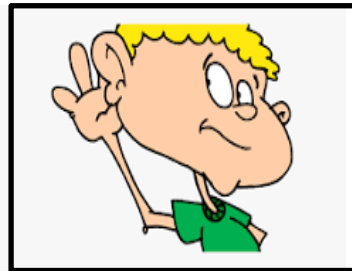

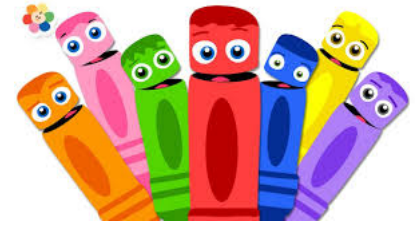
