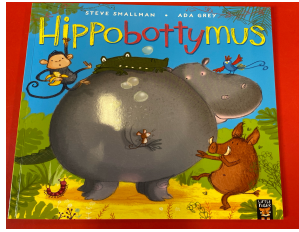


1. The Gruffalo needs your help! Which cards show words that rhyme/sound the same? You can cut out the cards and match them or you can write down the rhyming words.

Here are some of the pages from our new story, *Hippobottymus*. Now, Rhyme Detectives, for each page, find and write down the words that rhyme/sound the same.

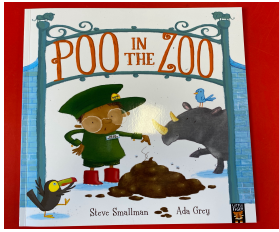


Well they danced and they played till a quarter to four.
