## The Diary of Samuel Pepys

Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> September 1666



Dear Diary,

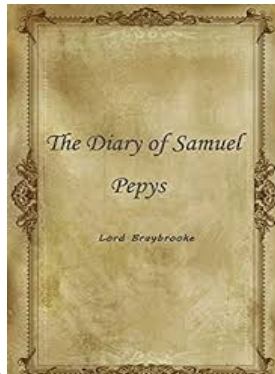


## Samuel Pepys

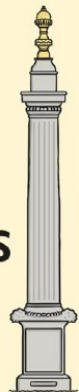
