A narrative poem is a poem that tells a story.

So a narrative poem will include:

- Characters
- Plot

Narrative poems often rhyme.

They are often read out just like a story.

Do you think 'The Dragon Who Ate Our School' is a narrative poem?

Read through 'The Dragon Who Ate Our School'.

Note whether:

- There is a plot
- Any characters
