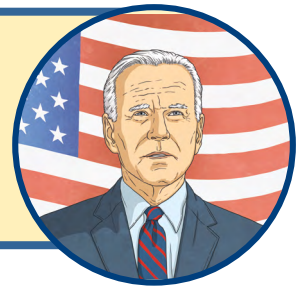


Joe Biden

Joe Biden is a politician and president-elect of the United States. He is due to be **inaugurated** as the 46th president on 20th January 2021. He served as the 47th vice-president to Barack Obama from 2009 to 2017.



Early Life

He was born on 20th November 1942 in Pennsylvania. His family moved to Delaware when he was still young. His parents were very hard working and taught him to be tough and to persevere in life.

As a child, Joe Biden had a stammer and was sometimes teased by other children. To manage his stammer, he learnt long poems and practised reciting them in front of the mirror.

Joe Biden earned a place at the prestigious Archmere Academy. To help pay for his tuition, he cleaned windows and weeded the gardens. He was a good leader and was elected class president. He went on to study history and political science at the University of Delaware and then studied law at Syracuse University Law School.

Career

In 1971, Joe Biden started his own law firm but also became more interested in politics. He joined the Democratic Party.

In 1972, he ran for the United States Senate, and at the age of 29, he became the fifth-youngest US senator in the nation's history. He went on to serve in the Senate until 2009.

Tragedy Strikes

Joe Biden married his first wife in 1966 and had three children.

Sadly, in 1972, tragedy struck when Joe Biden's wife and children were involved in a car accident. His wife and daughter died and his sons were badly injured. It took all his courage and perseverance to keep going at this difficult time.

He married again in 1977 and had another daughter.

Unfortunately, there was more sadness to come for Joe Biden, when in 2015, his eldest son died from brain cancer. Once again, despite his grief and sadness, Joe Biden had to overcome this **adversity** and carry on with his work.

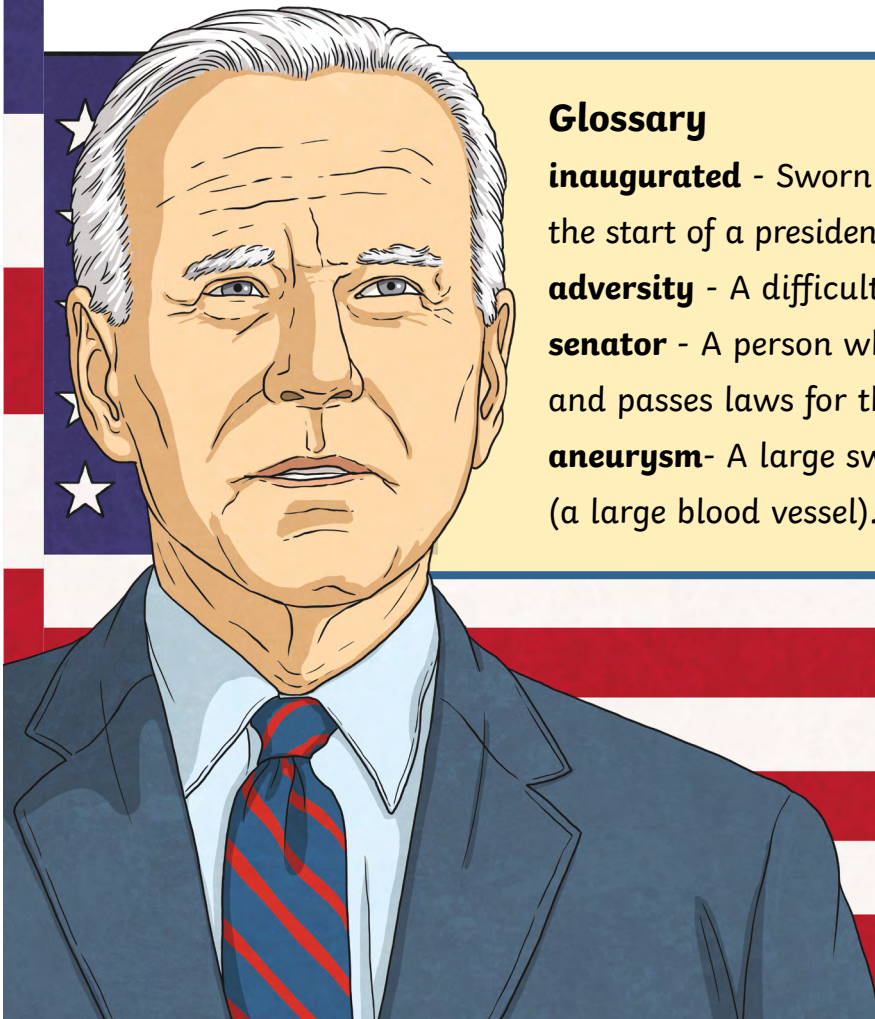
Becoming President

In 1987, Joe Biden decided to run for the US presidency in the 1988 election. Unfortunately, he had to drop out of his attempt and soon afterwards he had to have operations to treat two dangerous brain **aneurysms** and linked complications.

Twenty years later, in 2008, Joe Biden made his second bid to become president. He was unsuccessful but was asked to be Barack Obama's running mate. In January 2009, Barack Obama was inaugurated as president and Joe Biden became the 47th vice-president of the US.

On 12th January 2017, Barack Obama awarded Joe Biden with the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the nation's highest honour for a civilian. Obama called him 'the best vice-president America has ever had'.

In 2020, Joe Biden made a third attempt at the presidency. He stood as the Democratic candidate against Donald Trump and received more votes than any other presidential candidate in history. He will be 78 years old on inauguration day and would become the oldest president to be sworn into office.



Glossary

inaugurated - Sworn in at a special ceremony to mark the start of a president's four-year term of office.

adversity - A difficult or unpleasant situation.

senator - A person who is a member of the US Senate and passes laws for their country or state.

aneurysm - A large swelling in the wall of an artery (a large blood vessel).
