
# Year 4 home learning tasks week beginning 18.05.20

After you've done your drawing, label it to show what each part of the temple symbolises for Buddhists.

# Geography

This week we're going to learn about flags of South America. Get some plain paper and draw each flag and colour it in. We've uploaded some pictures to help you. Then cut out the flags and write

each country name on paper and cut them up too. Now you can either test yourself – see if you can match each flag to the correct country name – or play a pairs game with someone else – turn the flags and country names face down and take turns turning two at a time over to see if you can match pairs of flags and countries. The person with the most pairs at the end wins!
