## Year 5 Spellings week beginning 11th May Words ending in -ant, -ancy and -ance

These are this week's spellings. They all have the suffix '-ant'.

Changing the '-ant' suffix for '-ancy' or '-ance', adapts the word, changing it from an adjective to a noun.

E.g. The King was very <u>extravagant</u>: his home was filled with jewels, silks and gold.

The King's <u>extravagance</u> was clear: his home was filled with jewels, silks and gold.

The Queen was a very <u>dominant</u> person. She refused to let the King speak without her permission.

The Queen's extreme <u>dominancy</u> meant the King wasn't allowed to speak without her permission.
