These are this week's spellings. They all have the suffix '-ent'.

Changing the '-ent' suffix for '-ency' or '-ence', adapts the word, changing it from an adjective to a noun.

E.g.

The King proved that he was innocent.

The King proved his innocence.

The Queen was decent enough to apologise to the King.

The Queen had the decency to apologise to the King.
