<u>Maths:</u> This week we've been learning about time – telling the time, calculating time intervals and solving problems involving time. Practise this by doing an activity from below. Choose the right level for you!

#### Mild

Practise telling the time by keeping a



diary over a couple of days. Write the time and what you did. Read the time on an analogue clock face (the top one) – not a digital one (bottom one)!

E.g.

- 7.30am/half past 7 wake up, get ready.
- 7.50am/ten minutes to 8
- have breakfast.
- 8.05am/5 minutes past 8
- watch TV.
- 9.15am/ a quarter past 9
- Do home learning.

## Spicy

Keep a diary as explained for 'Mild', but calculate the time intervals for each activity too. E.g.: 7.30am/half past 7 – wake up, get ready. (20 mins)

- 7.50am/ten minutes to 8 have breakfast. (15 mins)
- 8.05am/5 minutes past 8 – watch TV. (1 hour
- 10 mins)
- 9.15am/ a quarter past
- 9 Do home learning.

## **Wonky Watches**

Mandeep's watch loses two minutes every hour. Adam's watch gains one minute every hour. They both set their watches from the radio at 6:00 a.m. then start their journeys to the airport. When they arrive (at the same time) their watches are 10 minutes apart. At what time (the real time) did they arrive at the airport? Hint: What time will each of their watches show after1 hour? 2 hours? Etc...

**Reading:** Rewrite a scene from your current book, integrating dialogue. Remember the golden rules of writing speech:

- Inverted commas " " around what is being said;
- Punctuation inside the inverted commas

• New speaker = New line

E.g.:

"Year 5 are the best class," exclaimed Ms Kingham proudly, "They're so kind!"
"I know!" agreed Ms Hanfling, nodding her head.
