Word of the Week: Climate The weather found in a certain place over a long period

of time is known as the climate. An area's climate determines what kinds of plants can grow and what kinds of animals can survive there. People use information about climates to decide which crops to plant, to prepare for natural disasters, and even to choose the best time to visit somewhere on holiday!

3. Either/Or

French: A little more practise on the months of the year, seasons and weather. Look back through 'Year 5 French Presentation 1st June' and 'Year 5 French Word Bank 1st June' if you need reminding of the vocabulary and have a go at some of these activities.

- On a plain piece of paper, draw a big circle and divide it into four quarters like this:
- Label each quarter with the name of a season and inside draw what the weather is like in that season. Write a short description in French. For example: *En printemps il fait beau, mais il pleut souvent*. In the spring the weather is fine, but it often rains.
- Write about your favourite season what kind of weather do you like best? What do you like to do when it is sunny or when it snows?
