
## Year 5 Spellings Week beginning 15<sup>th</sup> June

L.O.: I can spell words with a hyphen after the prefix.

The hyphen - is a punctuation mark used to join words, and to separate syllables of a single word.

Some words with prefixes need to have a hyphen added to separate the prefix and the root word. For example...



co-own

Working with a partner, can you discuss why these words might need hyphens?

Do the examples have anything in common?

All of these words have a prefix that ends in a vowel and a root word that begins in a vowel.



<u>re</u>-<u>e</u>ducate

<u>co</u>-own

This usually means that the prefix and root word are separated by a hyphen.



Here are this week's spellings.

They all have a hyphen separating the prefix from the root word, to avoid 2 vowels being next to each other.

The prefix 'co-' means to do together (in COmpany); the prefix 're-' means to do again (to REpeat).
