Reading: Read through chapter 13 of Floodlands pdf. Answer the class reading questions on this chapter. Write a short summary of the chapter.

Guided reading: Choose your spice level- Mild- 'Letters about fox hunting', Spicier- 'The Machine Gunners'. Answer ALL the questions for the text- set 1, 2 and 3. Keep up your daily reading too!

Maths: Go through Maths pdf, complete your fab four and the activities for each lesson.

RE: This term we are learning about the religion of Islam. I know some of you follow the Islamic faith so already know lots about this you can show all that you know over the next few weeks. We are starting recapping the five pillars of Islam. Look at the pdf and complete your learning – this could be on paper or on a computer.

Science: Our new topic in Science is 'living things and their habitats'. Look at the pdf on living things and classification and complete the learning set. There are 3 main tasks to do. You can do these on paper or on a computer.
