

Features of biographies

#### Menry VIII

Prince Henry Tudor was born on the 28th of June (1991) in the English town of Greenwich, located in England. Interestingly, he was the second son of King Henry VIII and Queen Elizabeth of York - Their third child overall. He had an older brother, Arthur, and the sisters named Mary and Margaret. As he was not the first heir to the threne, Henry was advacated to become a member of the clerry (A man of the church), which meant that he received an excellent advaction being fluent in four languages - English, Latin, Franch and Greek, However, this all changed when Henry reached the age of 10 as his older brother Arthur, died of an ear infection, which meant that Henry was to be the next King.

Reaching the age of 17, in the year 1506. The King of England (Henry VII) died and his eldest remaining son - Henry VIII - took to the throne becoming the King of England. After nine weeks as king, Henry decided to marry the Princes of Spain (Catherine of Anguen), who was his older brother's widow therefore they had to ask permission from the Pope to be married.

For the next twenty years, the two had a successful marriage. Catherine gave birth to a doughter (Mary T) but despite failing pregnant a number of times, she failed to give birth to a male heir. Utimately, this angened Henry and he went to the pape to have the marriage annulled, which here fused. Infuriated, Henry retaliated by breaking away from the Catholic Church, who had been the leading religion in England for over one thousand years. Thus creating the Church of England, where he was the leader (This became, known as the dissolution of the Monasteries and is one of the important events during Henry's reign of England).

Now that he was the leader of the church, he diverced Catherine of Angon (against her widels) and married the young Anne Bolleyn, who was already pregnant with his child During their mines, Anne gone brith to a doughter, who was henry's scend child, Blasbeth I. She was executed in 1936, in the tower of London, where she was behanded for her crimes.

Finally Henry married his sixth wife, Catherine Parr. She was more like a nurse to Henry as a journing accident had made it so that he struggled to walk and his body became covered in horroble boils. He grew incredibly for and died in his bedchamber on January 28<sup>th</sup>, 1547. It was told that they had to use a crune to remove Henry from the room, as he was too large to lift. He was buried next to Jane. Seymour, his third wife. (Many historians have argued that he was buried next to Jane, as she was his foreunte wife because she gave him a son.

#### Early life and childhood

Mary Berry was born on May 12th 1953 in Somerset, England, which she credits with contributing to her love of cooking because of her family's huge and well equipped kitchen. Mary went to the sports school of Millield. She grew up with her parents and brother: Jonathan, Lucy and Steven. Interestingly, Mary enjoyed sports, history and more obviously, cooking. Mary is now a multimillionaire with a successful empire of cookery books, television shows and sales of her cooking equipment.

#### Career highlights

At the beginning of her career. Mary worked for the Royal Kitchen where she worked for three years. Throughout this time, she trained in chopping, cutting, roasting and healthy cooking. Unfortunately, while preparing a meal, Berry broke her hand; this meant that she could no longer serve for the Royal Kitchen Although this might put others off, Mary decided this was the perfect time to plan and write her first cook book, becoming the youngest person to release a cookbook in 1874 at age just 23. At the age of 35 in 2009, she was made Head Judge on 'The Great British Bake Off'. Mary has raised millions of pounds for rity through her various activities, including: sponsored bake offs, cake sales and decorating competitions.

In 2007, it was revealed that Mary Berry did, in fact, not bake her own cakes as part of the television show 'The Great British Bake Off'. Instead, Berry preferre to use the cakes and pastries made by others and falsely claim that they were

Since she began working on her various television shows. Mary has sustained an Since she began working on her various television shows, Mary has sustained unbelievable amount of hijurise, including: toes broken due to falling casses dishes, hands cut because of renegade cheese graters and even a black eye caused by slipping on soup whilst cooking. However, because she has been cooking for such a long time, she has also stated a huge variety of foods, including: tiramisu, campoli, chocolate fondue and mango sorbet.

#### Chris Hadfield

Have you ever dreamed of doing something that makes you want to perform handstands and laugh? Well Chris Hadfield has. As a young man, with a true passion for flying, he dreamed of being an astronaut. Then he was chosen to train by NASA in the early 1990s, and went on to be the chief of the International Space Station operations in 2001. Later in 2012, he spent five months on (185) and became an internet sensation through his twitter feeds. Since leaving NASA he has become a professor in Ontario Canada.

#### Early year

Chris Hadfield was born on August 29 1959 in Sarnia Canada. Although raised on a rural farm he was a fanatical sportsman, by his mid-bens was an accomplished skier but flying was his true passion and he had already began to dream of being an astronaut. At 19, he joined the Canadian Armed Forces, training as a fighter pilot, spending two years at Military College in Victoria, British Columbia. He then followed that up with two years at Royal Military College in Kingston, Ontario, where he earned a bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering in 1982 whilst performing research work with NASA.

#### **Pioneering Canadian Astronaut**

By the early 1990s, Chris had flown more than 70 different kinds of aircraft and earned a name for himself—within military circles— in both Canada and the United States. Because of this, he was chosen from 5,330 applicants to become one of four Canadian astronauts in June 1992 and was stationed at NASA's Johnson Space Agency in Houston, Texas. Over the next two decades Hadfield full field many important roles within the space program including chief of International Space Station operations at the Johnson space centre. In addition to this, he became the first Canadian to freely float in space in 2001

#### Global Sta

In December 2012, Hadfield embarked on the most challenging mission of his life: Along with two other astronauts, he departed on a Russian spacecraft for a five-month stay at the International Space Station, Shortly before departing he laughed "To be able to command the space station, yes, it's professional, but for me, as just a Canadian kid, it makes me want to shout and laugh and do cartwheels." Over the next months, Hadfield enthralled space enthusiasts with his Twitterfeeds, offering insight into life aboard the station whilst taking and sharing sturning images of the universe around him. He also recorded a video of David Bowie's 'space oddity', which has received more than 7 million hits on you tube, Hadfield returned safely to Earth on May 13, 2013

#### Life after space

Shortly after returning, Hadfield announced his retirement from the space program and returned to his native Canada. On 8 October 2013, the University of Waterloo, Ontario Canada, announced that he would join them as a professor. He is now an adviser in their aviation program as well as assisting in ongoing research regarding the health of astronauts with their Faculty of Applied Health Sciences.






