

Key features of an biography text

Biography

- Written in the third person, for example 'During the Second World War, Anne hid for two years in an attic'.
- Life story of an individual written by another person. There have been many accounts of the life of Anne Frank written by different authors.
- The writer must carry out lots of research on the person they are writing about.
- Helps the reader to understand why the person is interesting.

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





What is a relative clause?

A relative clause is a type of subordinate clause that adapts or describes a noun.

Relative clauses add information to sentences by usually using a relative pronoun such as 'who', 'that' or 'which'.


