

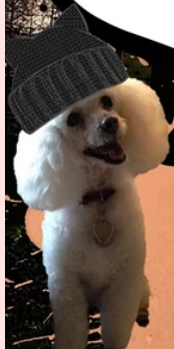

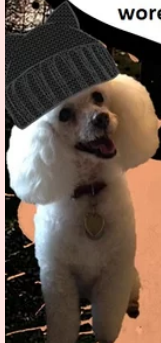
Leo's word of the day:
