








Well done to our 'Stars of the Week' for their hard work and effort in class.





In Year 4 they have been looking at the Artist Frida Khalo and creating their own work in her style.
















Clubs started this week with great take up—many clubs are full with over 20 children in them. A couple of spaces remain—see Lisa for availability.
