Can you help—research into air pollution?

We have been contacted by a research team at Imperial College London who are looking for participants to participate in a study. The study is aimed to understand peoples' attitudes and behaviours towards air pollution effects on health and to reduce levels of exposure through behavioural changes. We know that the environment and pollution is something our children (and we) feel very strongly about and we would like to support this research if we can. They have asked us to share the following message with you and hope you will be able to help them by taking part:

The title of the study is "Understanding the willingness of individuals to reduce air pollution exposure and how behavioural change can be promoted". The study is aimed to understand peoples' attitudes and behaviours towards air pollution effects on health and to reduce levels of exposure through behavioural changes. As part of the study you will be sent a questionnaire and you will be invited to attend a focus group/interview (telephone or face to face). This will be followed by another questionnaire 2 to 3 weeks later. A-Z-Indian Feast



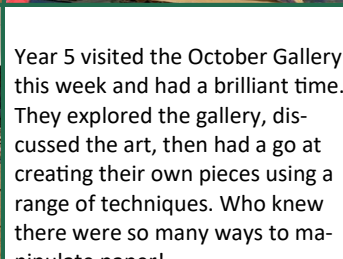

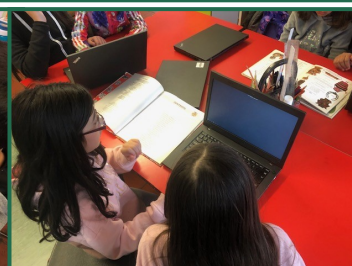

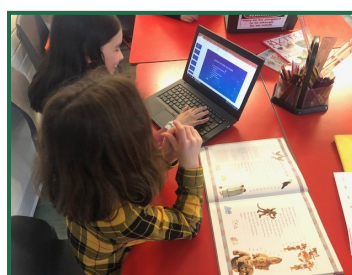
