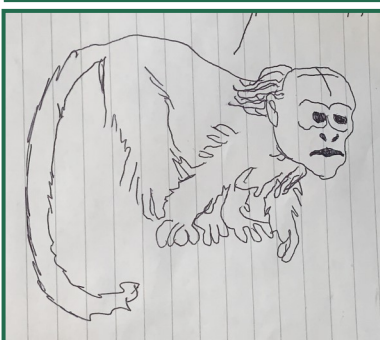


Message from the head:

There are many things to take into account and plan for, in order for the children to come back and I assure you that I will keep you informed regarding the school opening, when I have the necessary information and the plans in place for a safe return. We sent out week one's challenge last week in a separate letter. I hope some of you have been able to engage with this. I hope you are remaining safe and enjoy what the VE Day bank holiday weekend.

Free School Meal Status

We are aware that many people at this time could be struggling financially. Some people may also have lost their jobs due to the closing of businesses and the measures imposed by the government. If you fall into this category and think you may be eligible for 'Free School Meals' status we would urge you to apply via the following link <https://contact.camden.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals/>. The government and Camden are providing food or food vouchers of up to £15 per child, per week for those children eligible for the free school meals while schools are closed. This could be very useful to you and your family. We already know of some families in this situation who have been in touch and there may well be more of you out there. Please note that for those with children in Reception to Year 2 who receive a Universal Free School Meal (under the Government scheme), this is different to Free School Meal status (and is based on whether you are in receipt of certain state benefits) - so please apply if you think you may be entitled. If you need help applying, you can email Lisa in the office via the school admin email address (admin@fleet.camden.sch.uk) — put 'FSM' in the subject header and she can support you to make an application through Camden. This way we can help make sure you get access to any support out there you are entitled to.

Phonics

- This is a weekly challenge so there will be plenty of opportunities to take part again. Look out for our next challenge which will be announced on Wednesday 13th May.



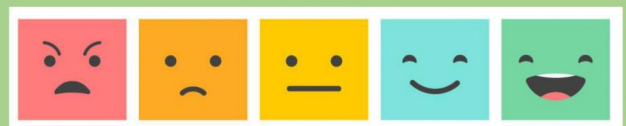

These are very difficult times for everyone but one of the positives to come out of this situation is the amount of goodwill and support for each that is out there. If you are facing particular difficulties brought about by lack of employment, financial hardship, health conditions there are groups out there that may be able to help. You may not need these services yourself but know someone in Camden who does. Please see the information below:

Mutual Aid groups

Support with picking up shopping, medication, signposting to other helpful organisations.

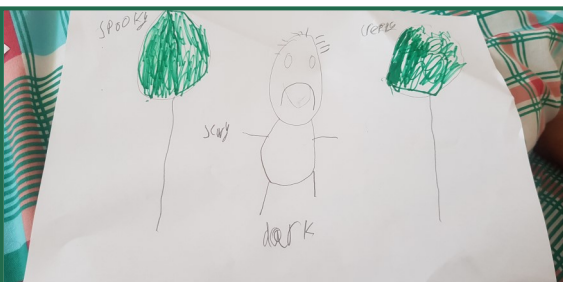
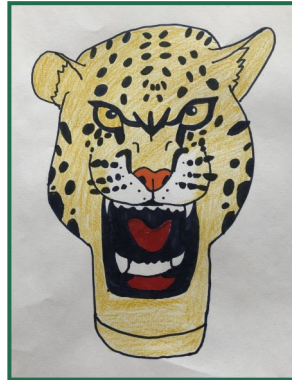

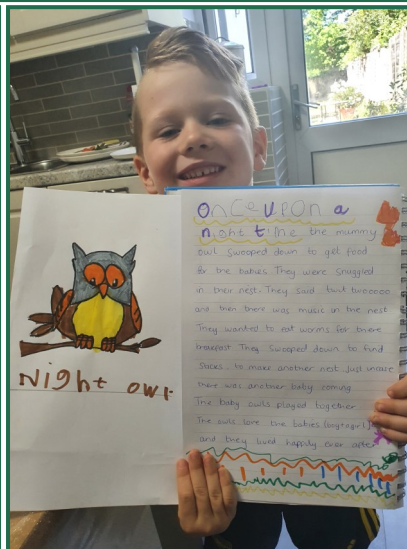

 This was a starry night.

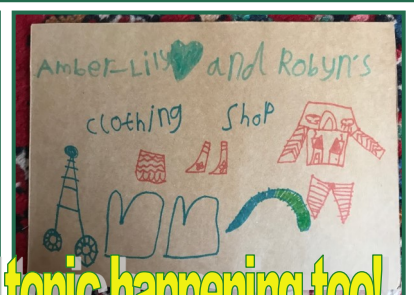
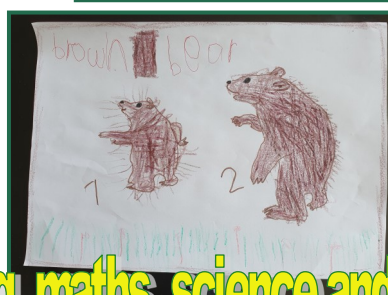
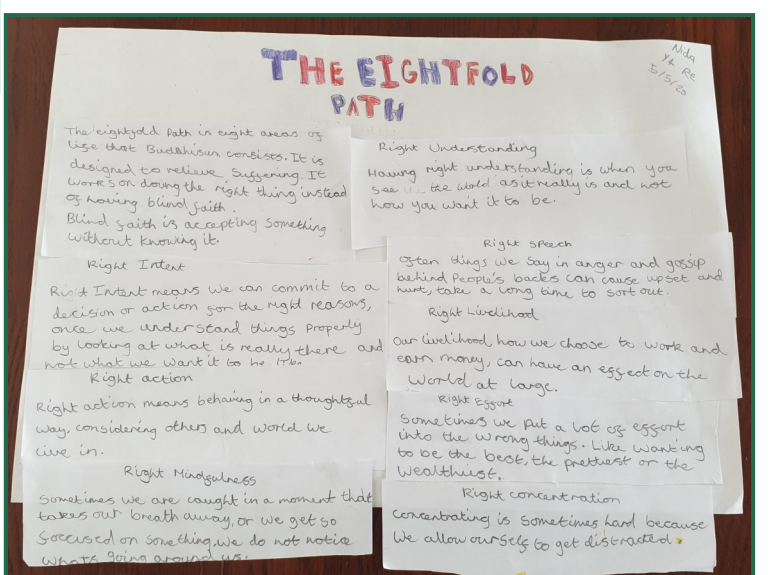
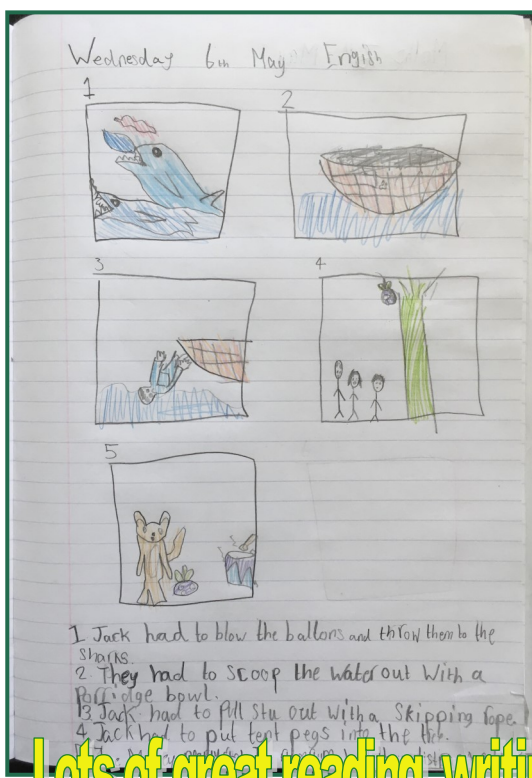
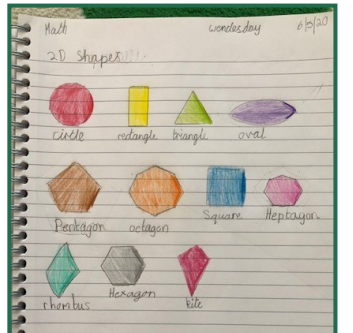
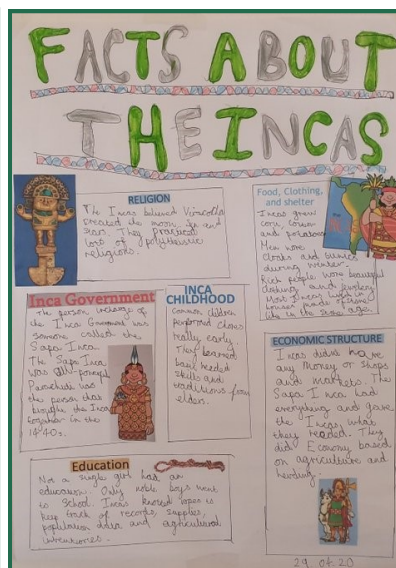
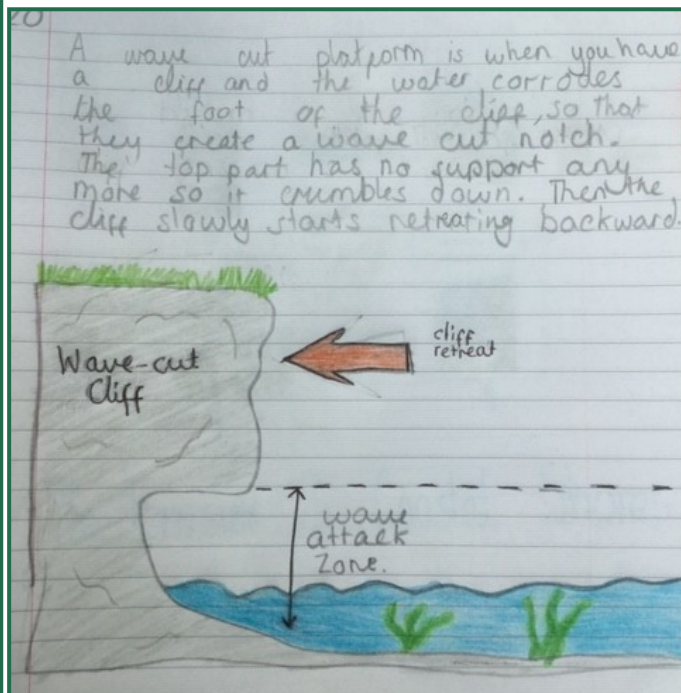


15th May 2020 David English homework. Spelt

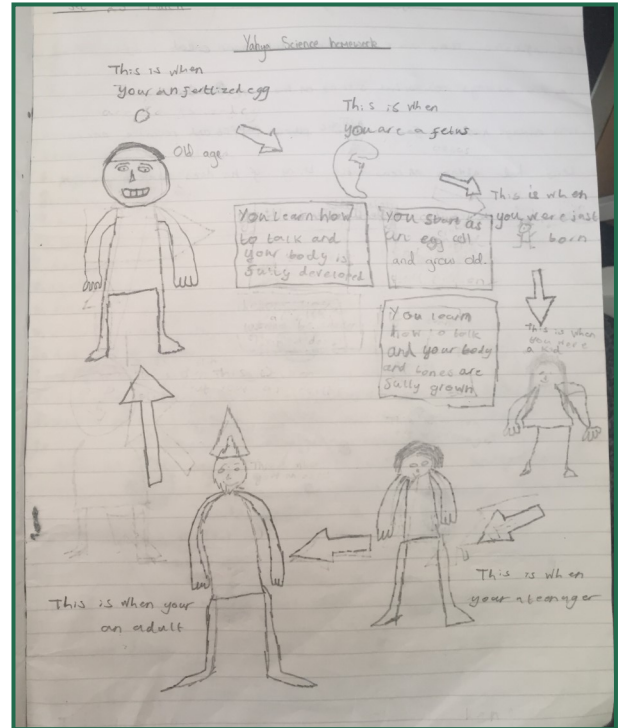

Excellent Jaguar

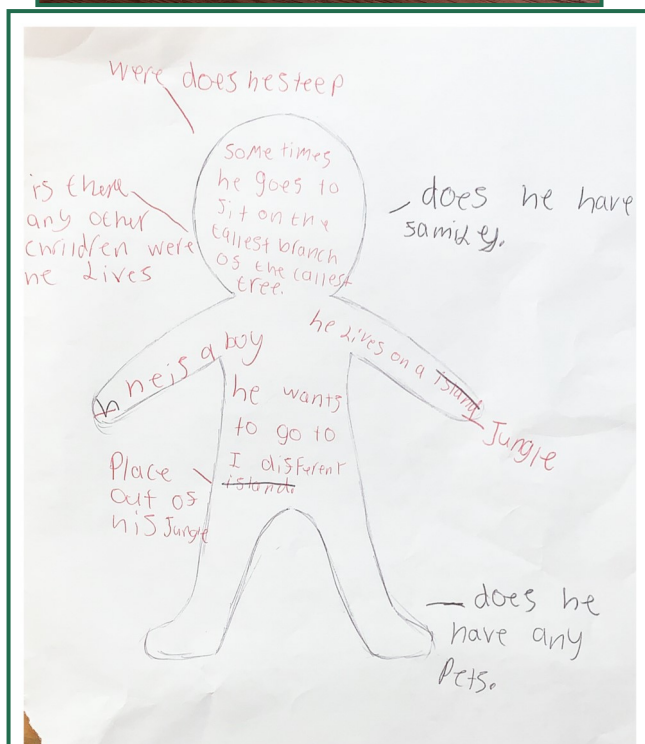
Jaguars live in the Amazon Rainforest. The Amazon is in South America.

Ocelots can swim which is very unusual for a cat. Ocelots live in the rainforest. Ocelots are nocturnal which means they are active at night.

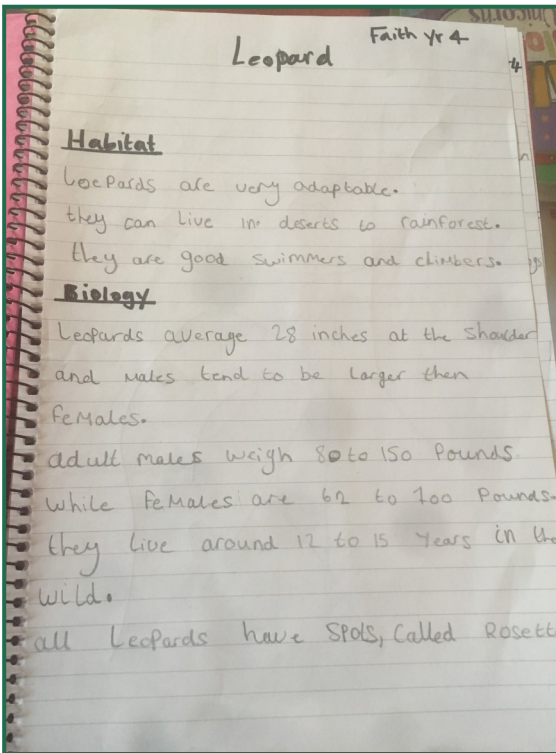
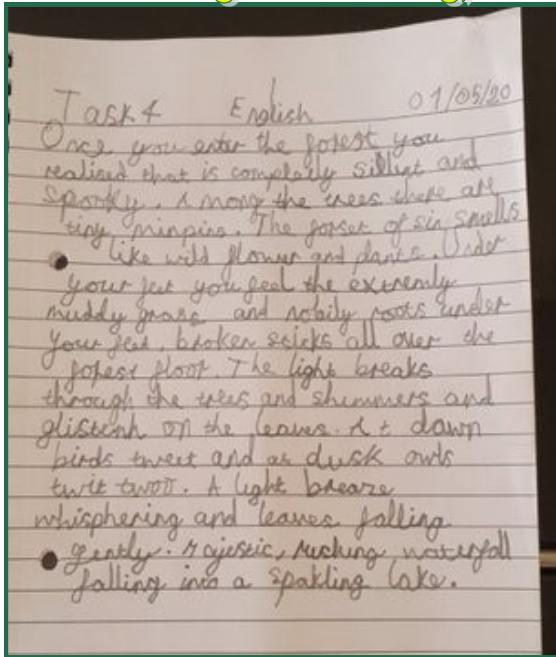
Habitat

Biology
Ocelots' bodies are very sleek. Their underbody is white up to their neck. Most of their body is covered with solid black spots and stripes. An ocelot's tail is up to 2 feet long. They are nocturnal animals. They weigh around 20 lbs.
