

Message from the head:

I'd like to thank you all for your support this term. It has been a tough one for many reasons. Since returning to face to face education you have all been fantastically supportive. I wish you all a pleasant Easter break and hope that you are able to enjoy some of the newly restored freedoms the gradual easing of lockdowns is affording us. Please read this newsletter carefully as there are a number of important announcements in it, including about parent meetings on the INSET day, what to do if your child tests positive over the holidays, how to get test kits for regular testing for the adults in your household, information on a number of fantastic activities happening over the holidays and the amazing entries from the children for this year's Easter Egg competition! Developing Symptoms and Testing Positive over the holidays...

If your child develops symptoms of Covid and subsequently tests positive over the holidays you may need to let us know. **IF they were in school at any point 48 hours before the symptoms started we need to know.** So in other words if they develop symptoms at **any point before Sunday 4th April** and then, when tested, come back positive, you need to email the office on admin@fleet.camden.sch.uk to let us know as soon as possible.

This is so we can inform any other families whose children came into contact during the contagious period so they can isolate. If your child develops symptoms from the 4th April onwards and then tests positive you do not need to tell us as they would not have been in contact with their classmates during the infectious period. Parent Meetings Via Zoom—Monday 19th Apr



You were sent a letter this week via ParentHub/Text with the joining details for your parent meeting on zoom. These will be taking place on Monday 19th April, our

INSET day. If you have not received this letter please contact the office first thing on Monday 19th so we can resend it and avoid you missing your slot.

Rapid Home Testing for Adults

We are now acting as a pick up point for our families who want to take part in the Covid Regular Rapid Home Testing. You can collect kits from us for all the adults in your household and then carry out routine tests on yourself twice weekly. The tests only take 30 minutes to return a result which you then log online. This initiative is to increase capacity to pick up on asymptomatic cases in the community and reduce the risk of people spreading the virus when they do not know they are infected. The staff have been doing these since the end of January and we would encourage all adults in our community to take part too. We have already given a number out yesterday and today.

These tests are not for people who exhibit symptoms, in that case you would still be expected to visit a test site for a PCR test (or order a postal one) and self-isolate.

The test kits are for the adults in the house, not children—Primary school children should not do these tests and secondary age children are already able to access this testing through their schools. If you haven't already collected some they can be collected at pick up or drop off or by coming to the school office. We can also send them home with your child if they travel to school alone.

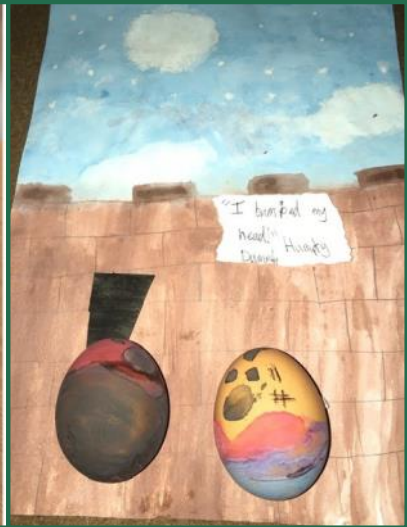

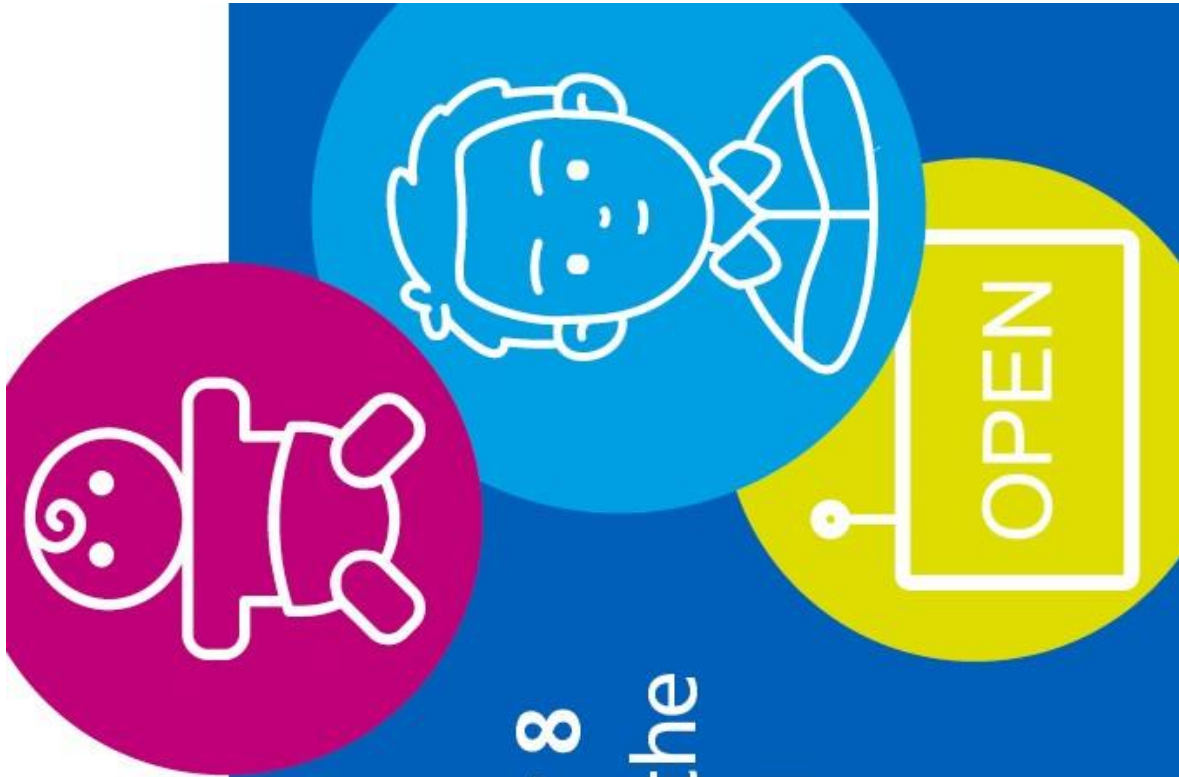
Last year, [temporary changes](#) were made to paediatric services in north central London (NCL) to ensure patients and families could continue to receive safe and high quality care during a period of increased demand for services due to COVID-19. These changes were always temporary and the NHS in NCL have now agreed it is safe to reopen the children and young people's accident and emergency departments and general inpatient wards at **University College Hospital from 9am on Thursday 8 April** and at the **Royal Free Hospital from 9am on Monday 12 April**. Until the University College Hospital and the Royal Free Hospital sites reopen, children and young people should continue to access emergency care through alternative hospitals. Options include the southern hub at the Whittington Hospital, North Middlesex University Hospital and Barnet Hospital. If any parent is unsure where to take a child in need of emergency treatment they should visit 111.nhs.uk or call the NHS 111 service. In a life-threatening emergency, dial 999 immediately.
