Overall for the year, at the moment we have 3 year groups above 96% for the year—Year 3, 5 and 6. Year 2 and 4 are very close. We are at 95.5% for the school for the year. Please keep doing all you can to encourage attendance for the remainder of the summer term. Let's keep improving!

It could be someone we have talked about in assembly, or someone you have learnt about in class or even someone you have learnt about from your own reading or investigations.










This week in Reception... Topic: Paws, Jaws, Claws and Roars!



This week in Year 1... Topic: History Detectives
